

## TLIF2080 - Safely Access the Rail Corridor (RIW)

### Course Overview

Safely Access the Rail Corridor (previously known as RISI, Rail Industry Safety Induction) course is a nationally recognised competency TLIF2080 - Safely Access the Rail Corridor. An individual cannot access the rail corridor for work purposes without acquiring this competency.

The RIW course provides participants with awareness of the important safety requirements and hazards as well as legal obligations that they need to identify and eventually deal with as they work in the rail corridor. Hand signals are taught, worksite protection management and basic rules for those in the danger zone.



### Duration

1 Day

### Target

Individuals who are required to perform work in the Transport for NSW rail corridor or for those who are seeking employment in the NSW rail industry.

### Entry Requirements

- Wear enclosed shoes and appropriate clothing including long pants (no clothing should be red or green).
- Over 17 years of age
- Must have a USI number to enrol in training. If you do not yet have one, please visit this website <http://www.usi.gov.au> to create one. Click "Create USI"

### Assessment

Assessment is a combination of written questions/answers and practical demonstrations.

### Learning Outcomes

- Knowledge of rail terminology
- Basic signalling indications
- Rules and regulations for people working in the rail corridor
- Knowledge of a safe place
- Electrical safety
- Personal & legal requirements of fatigue, drugs and alcohol

### On Completion

Upon successful completion of training, participants will be issued with a Statement of Attainment for TLIF2080 - Safely Access the Rail Corridor.

## FAQ's About RIW (previously RISI)

### Why do you need to do this training?

Safely Access the Rail Corridor course aims to establish a national approach to competency management for those working in rail. The rail safety worker program meets regulatory requirement and complies with national rail safety law.

You must successfully complete the RIW course before entering the rail corridor to work.

### Medical Requirements

The medical criteria for RIW is successful completion of a Category 3 Health Assessment (hearing, vision, mobility) and drug and alcohol screening (breath & urine analysis). The medical assessment must be conducted by a Transport for NSW authorised medical practitioner.

### What happens after you successfully complete the RIW course and Cat 3 Medical with Train Me RTO?

1. Your Statement of Attainment and a copy of your medical report will be sent to you, if you are a sole trader, or the company if you aren't a sole trader, by Train Me RTO within 3-7 working days.
2. Your employer (or you, if you are a sole trader) will then need complete the following steps to organise your RIW /RISI Card or go to <https://www.riw.net.au/about-us/#new-process>
3. Complete [application form here](#) (if a login has already been created for the company please ignore Step 3 and proceed to Step 4).
4. When the primary contact first logs into the system they will be asked to pay annual company subscription. Once payment is completed, full system functionality will be granted.
5. The primary contact may now add workers to the system. This step also includes undertaking the 100 Point ID check online. You can find more information [here](#).
6. Once the ID check is approved, you can request a physical RIW Card or virtual RIW card for your worker. The virtual RIW card can be issued immediately, the physical RIW card is printed and issued by Australia Post.
7. You can now assign job roles and competencies to your workers profile, manage drugs and alcohol assessments, and manage worker medical restrictions.
8. Worker can now use their own individual worker portal (myRIW) to manage their roles, competencies, update personal details and view any blocks or suspensions.
