

TLIF0020 - Safely Access the Rail Corridor

Course Overview

The Safely Access the Rail Corridor (TLIF0020) course is a nationally recognised competency, previously known as the Rail Industry Safety Induction or RISI. An individual cannot access the rail corridor for work purposes without acquiring this competency.

The RISI provides participants with awareness of the important safety requirements and hazards as well as legal obligations that they need to identify and eventually deal with as they work in the rail corridor. Hand signals, worksite protection management and basic rules make up some of the study areas taught for those in the danger zone.



Duration

1 Day

Target

Individuals who are required to perform work in the Transport for NSW rail corridor or for those who are seeking employment in the NSW rail industry.

Entry Requirements

- Safety Boots and appropriate clothing including long pants and long sleeve top need to be worn (no clothing should be red or green)
- 17 years of age or older
- Must have a USI number, If you do not yet have one, please visit their website <http://www.usi.gov.au> to create one.

Assessment

Assessment is a combination of written questions and practical observation.

Learning Outcomes

- Knowledge of rail terminology
- Basic signalling indications
- Rules and regulations for people working in the rail corridor
- Knowledge of a safe place
- Electrical safety
- Personal & legal requirements of fatigue, drugs and alcohol

On Completion

Upon successful completion of training, participants will be issued with a Statement of Attainment for TLIF0020 - Safely Access the Rail Corridor.

FAQ's About RISI

Why do you need to do this training?

The SARC Course aims to establish a national approach to competency management for those working in the NSW rail networks. The Rail Industry Worker program meets regulatory requirements and complies with national rail safety law.

You must have completed your SARC Course and obtain your RIW Card before entering the rail corridor to work.

Medical Requirements

The medical criteria for RISI is successful completion of a Category 3 Health Assessment (hearing, vision and mobility) and Drug and Alcohol Screening (breath & urine analysis). The medical assessment must be conducted by a Transport for NSW Authorised Health Professional.

What happens after you successfully complete the SARC course and CAT3 Medical with Train Me RTO?

1. Your Statement of Attainment and a copy of your Medical report will be sent to you (or employer if requested) by Train Me RTO within 2-4 business days.
2. You (if you are a sole trader and have your own ABN number) or your primary employer will then need to apply for the RIW Card. Steps on how to submit your application can be found on their website. Once your RIW Card and Number is issued, you can start managing your Cardholder Profile, Competencies and Job Roles.
3. You can now start work on NSW Rail Corridors & Networks!

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
